Top songwriters to help at-risk girls express their voices in lyrics

GRAMMY winner Lisa Loeb and others to mentor girls and perform their lyrics at WriteGirl Songwriting Workshop

WHAT: More than 100 underserved teen girls from all over Los Angeles will work alongside 100 women writers and acclaimed singer-songwriters at the 17th Annual WriteGirl Songwriting Workshop on Saturday, March 3 at The Huntington Library, Art Collections and Botanical Gardens. Renowned women singer-songwriters, including GRAMMY winner Lisa Loeb, will share their creative processes and help girls transform their words into lyrics. The event culminates in an exciting showcase where the guest singer-songwriters will take to the stage and perform the girls' lyrics.

WHO: More than a dozen prominent singer-songwriters are confirmed, including:

- LISA LOEB, a GRAMMY award-winning artist, author and philanthropist who started her career with the platinum-selling Number 1 hit song "Stay (I Missed You)."
- KREWELLA, the electronic sister duo, Jahan and Yasmine Yousaf, who have performed at Coachella & Lollapalooza, and whose debut album features the platinum record hit "Alive."
- LOUISE GOFFIN, singer-songwriter, recording producer and producer of GRAMMY-nominated record "A Holiday Carole" for her mother Carole King.

 MICHELLE LEWIS, solo artist and songwriter with decades writing for top artists like Cher, Lisa Loeb, Amy Grant and Katharine McPhee.

WHY: The WriteGirl Songwriting Workshop provides an opportunity for Los Angeles teen girls to express their emotions, ideas and what they want to change in the world. With guidance from acclaimed songwriters and other professional women writers, girls are able to learn how to craft effective lyrics that can connect with a wider audience. The workshop encourages girls to develop their creative writing skills, increase their confidence and envision brilliant futures for themselves.
