YA Authors and Los Angeles Teens Make Fiction Come Alive WriteGirl Workshop Hosted at The Petersen Automotive Museum on April 6th

LOS ANGELES – Amidst the style and splendor of vintage cars and motorcycles, WriteGirl teens conjured imaginative stories with the help WriteGirl mentors, and notable YA Authors, on April 6th at the Petersen Automotive Museum.

During the two-hour workshop, teens developed characters and stories surrounded by brightly colored hot rods, retro futuristic concept cars, and famous rides like the Batmobile and Herbie the Love Bug. Guest authors Katie Alender (*Bad Girls Don't Die*) and Francesca Lia Block (*Weetzie Bat*) helped girls explore fiction writing and story prompts inspired by the Petersen – Recall the last faces you saw in cars passing by – Describe your ideal passenger – If you could go on a road trip in any car here, what car would you choose and where would you go?

"For our 12th annual Fiction Workshop, we wanted to take girls on a journey to spark their creativity," said Keren Taylor, WriteGirl's Executive Director. "The Petersen Automotive Museum was the perfect place to let fiction come alive, and Katie and Francesca were the perfect authors to encourage and inspire the girls.

Throughout the past 12 years, WriteGirl has successfully helped **100% of participating** seniors to not only graduate from high school but also enroll in college, many on full or partial scholarships. This past fall, WriteGirl teens headed to Harvard, CSU Fullerton, UCLA, University of Wisconsin—Madison, Grinnell, Macalester, Azusa Pacific University, and CSU Channel Islands, just to name a few.

More than 350 girls participate in WriteGirl annually — an enormous increase from WriteGirl's initial group of 30 at its inception in 2001. Over the past decade, WriteGirl's success can be measured by the achievements of its alumnae who continue to study, work and contribute their unique voices around the world.
